

## DECLARATION

I, Douglas A. Schafer declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Washington that the following is true to the best of my knowledge:

On Thursday, February 8, 1996, I spent approximately two hours meeting with the Supervisory Special Agent, Ellen Glasser, at the Tacoma office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation apprising her of information in my possession indicating that Pierce County Superior Court Judge Grant L. Anderson had acted unlawfully in his handling of the Charles C. Hoffman Estate. That evening at the Tacoma-Pierce County Bar Association's Lincoln Day Banquet, I approached Washington State Supreme Court Justice Charles W. Johnson and informed him that I had been meeting earlier that day with the FBI about evidence indicating that a Pierce County judge was a corrupt individual. I told him that I was aware of a case from the prior July in which it appeared, from a newspaper account, that the Supreme Court had administratively suspended a King County judge then under investigation for serious misconduct. I told him that I thought that an immediate suspension would be appropriate in the case of the Pierce County judge, and I asked him to let me know how I might initiate that process.

Justice Johnson phoned my office at 4:25 p.m. the next day, February 9, 1996, from his home in Gig Harbor, leaving a request with my secretary that I call him back., which I promptly did the same day. He informed me that he had looked into the handling of the case to which I had referred—that of King County District Court Judge Rosemary Bordlemay. He told me that there was some uncertainty as to whether the Supreme Court had authority to summarily suspend a judge, and that the Chief Justice on July 7, 1995 had written to the Commission on Judicial Conduct ("CJC") concerning a procedure for summarily placing a judge on administrative leave.

The message slip appended as Exhibit A to the original of this Declaration is the original message slip from "Chuck Johnson" on February 9, 1996. The handwriting through his phone number line is that of Zan Conlon, my then secretary. The handwriting "7/7/95" and below is my own handwriting from my conversation on February 9, 1996 with Justice Johnson. The handwriting "F: 851-7343" is mine, added to the slip in December 1997 when I obtained from Justice Johnson his home fax number so that I could fax to him papers from the CJC's public file reporting the pending federal criminal grand jury investigation of William L. Hamilton, who had paid for Judge Anderson's Cadillac.

Exhibit B is the Tacoma News Tribune article from July 2, 1995 about the case of King County District Court Judge Rosemary Bordlemay. Exhibit C includes a calling card of and phone message slip from FBI Special Agent Ellen Glasser, to corroborate the statement made above.
